This workshop will explore questions of justice in relation to finance, or more broadly, in relation to complex social systems that are largely man made (legally constructed), yet generate harmful effects that are difficult to predict ex ante and account for ex post. We have four guest speakers drawn from Philosophy and Law with expertise in areas as diverse as international taxation, unemployment, property rights, and the corporate form. Their contributions present an opportunity to learn more about their specific field of inquiry, but also to connect their work to aspects of the Legal Theory of Finance and develop ideas for future research that connects LTF more explicitly to theories of justice.
